The Competition.	<p>Thanks to STEM, we could be playing football on the moon in years to come. For this year's Engineer a Better World competition, we're asking children to design a football kit for the very first football team on the moon – Moon United.</p> <p>Our Competition and Awards Standard Terms apply to this competition. We refer to these in this competition entry form as the Standard Competition Terms. Please ensure that you read and understand the Standard Competition Terms before submitting a competition entry. Who are we?	<p>THE INSTITUTION OF ENGINEERING AND TECHNOLOGY, a charity registered in England and Wales and in Scotland with charity numbers 211014 and SC038698 respectively, whose registered address is at Savoy Place, London, WC2R 0BL, UK</p>

Who can enter?	<p>This competition is open to entries from the following category of individuals:</p> <p>Residents of the UK aged five (5) to thirteen (13) years of age, except for the immediate family or members of the same household of any individual who is:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) Our employee or an employee of one of our holding or subsidiary companies; or (b) an employee of any agent or supplier who is professionally connected with the competition (including its administration) or any sponsor of the competition. <p>Only one (1) entry per eligible individual (referred to in these T&C's as an "entrant") is permitted. There is no purchase necessary and there is no charge to enter the competition.</p>
How to enter.	<p>Internet access is required. Entry forms for the competition are available for download on www.engineer-a-better-world.org. The competition entry form also sets out the instructions that entrants are to follow when creating the design.</p> <p>There are two categories – one for four (4) to eight (8) year olds and the other nine (9) to thirteen (13) year olds.</p> <p>The entry form must be completed in accordance with its instructions and signed by the entrant's parent/guardian</p>

	<p>(such parent/guardian being referred to in these T&C's as "You", "you", "Your", "your" etc). You must provide your contact details as requested. All entries must then be sent to moonunited@theiet.org</p> <p>Competition entries may be submitted from 00:01 (BST), on 12 June ("Opening Date") and all entries must be submitted by 23.59 (BST), on 15 September ("Closing Date").</p> <p>Any entries received before the Opening date or after the Closing date, along with any entries that do not fulfil these entry rules or are otherwise not eligible or permitted under these T&C's will be automatically excluded from the competition.</p>
Competition opening and closing date.	<p>Opening Date: From 00:01 (BST) on 12 June 2023</p> <p>Closing Date: By 23:59 (BST) on 15 September 2023</p>
Judging process and criteria.	<p>Entries for the 4-8 age category will be judged on the following criteria (the "Criteria")</p> <p><u>Originality</u> – how new and original is the idea?</p> <p><u>Creativity</u> – how creative is the idea?</p> <p><u>Personality</u> - how does the design bring to life the things the entrant loves?</p> <p>Entries for the 9-13 age category will be judged on the following criteria (the "Criteria")</p> <p><u>Originality</u> - how original is the idea?</p> <p><u>Creativity</u>- how creative is the idea?</p> <p><u>Engineering</u>- what makes the entrant's kit perfectly engineered for the moon and different from an Earth football kit?</p> <p><u>Personality</u>- how does the design bring to life the things the entrant loves/ the entrant's personality?</p> <p>The judging process for each category will be as follows:</p> <p>Stage 1: all entries will be assessed in the first instance by our appointed communications agency who will select thirty (30) entries that best meet the Criteria in each category (the "Shortlist") to go forward to Stage 2.</p>

	<p>Stage 2: the judging panel (as described below) will review the Shortlist and will select three (3) entries that best meet the Criteria. From those three, the judging panel will decide two (2) overall category winners of the competition.</p> <p>The names and/or other personal information of entrants will not be provided for the purpose of the judging/selection of winners.</p>
The judging panel.	<p>The panel will comprise of the following judges:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ama Frimpong, 2022 IET Young Woman Engineer of the Year as our representative. • Brian David Johnson, Professor of Practice at Arizona State University's School for the Future of Innovation in Society and a Futurist and has been invited to be a judge of the competition by us. • A sports person
Details of any third parties involved in the competition.	<p>Our appointed communication agency COW PR LLP (COW) will assess all entries in the first instance against the criteria. COW will select thirty entries that best meet the Criteria (the shortlist) to go forward for final judging.</p> <p>COW will also support with the winner's announcement, promoting this to the media and across the IET's channels.</p>
The prize(s).	<p>We're offering the overall winner of each category the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A wearable kit with the entrant's winning design printed onto it for the winner and their friends (10 in total – 5 home kits, and 5 away kits) • Please note this will not include any tech or gadgets <p>The football kits created from the winning entrant's design will be delivered on or before 25 October, subject to any delays in manufacturing in which case we will notify you.</p>
Winners' announcement.	<p>The overall winners of each category will be announced by us through various media channels including the IET website (www.engineer-a-better-world.org) and social media accounts owned or controlled by us during the week commencing 30 October ("Announcement Date"). This could be subject to change.</p>

	<p>For the purposes of the winners' announcement, the entrants full name, age and area of the UK in which they reside (e.g. city or town) will be published along with the Competition entry/design where appropriate. Details of the winners will be visible on the IET website for a period of thirty (30) days from the Announcement Date. We may also announce the winners through other media outlets such as television or radio but have no obligation to do so.</p> <p>Personal communication (winners only)</p> <p>We will contact you if your entrant has been selected as the overall winner as soon as practicable after the Announcement Date using the email address or other contact details you have provided on the competition entry form. You must respond to us in order to claim the prize within ten (10) days of us contacting/informing you.</p>
Details of any presentation event.	<p>We will hold a presentation event during which the overall winners will be presented with their prize and provided with an opportunity to be included in publicity photos for the competition. The presentation will take place on/at a mutually convenient date (weekdays only) and time, in October 2023 at a location (to be confirmed).</p> <p>Where you have claimed the prize, we will advise you of details of the event once this has been confirmed and invite you, the winning entrant and any other parent or guardian of the winning entrant to attend. Please note, the date of the presentation is subject to change depending on production of the winning football kits. We will cover travel expenses for the overall winner (and their parents/legal guardians) up to £200 per winner.</p>
Ownership of Competition entries.	<p>The IET will not own the rights (including copyright) in competition entries submitted. However, the IET shall be permitted to use [e.g. all OR the winner(s) competition entries] in accordance with the licence terms as set out in clause 10.1.3 of the Standard Competition Terms.</p> <p>If your entrant is a winner, we may from time to time use the competition entry, along with the full name, age and area of the UK in which the winning entrant resides (e.g. city or town) for ongoing publicity purposes relating to the competition in any format (including magazines and website articles for promotional purposes relating to the competition) and you confirm that such use of the competition entry and information of the entrant will not affect the rights of any other third party or breach any other laws.</p> <p>If your entrant is the overall winner, you acknowledge and agree, on behalf of the entrant that, with the exception of any copyright in the competition entry which may be owned by the entrant, the entrant shall have no rights in and to any</p>

We also process information so that we can perform a contract (to do what we say we will do in the competition Terms & Conditions (www.engineer-a-better-world.org/get-involved) For example, so that we can contact the parent/guardian of a winning entrant to tell them that their entrant has won.</p> <p>Who we share personal information with</p> <p>The IET share and process some personal information about competition entrants, (as joint controllers) with COW PR LLP (COW), for the following purposes (which are described in the competition Terms & Conditions):</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The judging process and revealing the winners – The competition entry and entrant ID number will be shared and processed by both organisations in order to select the winners. Once selected, information of the winning entrants (full name, age, area/town of residence) will be shared with COW: • Announcing the winners – the IET will announce the winning entrants by publishing the winners full name, age, area/town of residence (along with competition entry where appropriate) on their various media channels. This will include but is not limited to the IET websites and social media channels. • Producing the prize for the overall winner and presentation – the overall winning competition entry will be used to produce the prize for the overall winner.
